Location

Durham, in the North East of England, is ideally located for exploring both the countryside and the coast, and day trips to York, Edinburgh and even the Lake District. In just three hours by train you can be in London, and Newcastle International Airport is located nearby for easy transport links.

English as a Foreign Language Programme (EFL)

Overview

This EFL Programme is perfect for any level international students looking to develop their ability to express themselves fluently and accurately in a variety of formal and less formal situations. Students can work towards internationally recognised English Language qualifications in speaking, listening, reading and writing skills.

This programme includes general and academic English and preparation for IELTS. Learners will be provided with opportunities to take part in cross-cultural exchanges and community-based volunteering projects, as well as partnership work with native English-speaking students in the College.

You can study from 5 hours to 20 hours per week.



The programme aims to:

- Give learners the English and academic skills needed for life, study and work in the UK
- Help learners develop general English communication skills
- Support learners as they adapt to both general and academic life in the UK
- Provide learners with an understanding of grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation
- Help learners develop an understanding of different varieties of English (academic, formal and informal speech and writing)
- Encourage learners to practise talking about different topics of interest to develop their accuracy and fluency in using English

Teaching & assessment

Each learner receives a full assessment of their language skills at the start of the programme and is provided with a personalised timetable designed to meet their specific needs. Regular assessment throughout the course ensures that learners can progress and achieve their full potential at their own pace. Each learner is assigned a personal tutor who helps guide and manage their individual programme and plans for progression.

Entry requirements and Levels

All students are level tested prior to enrolment to ensure you are placed in the appropriate level class for you.

Levels

We offer classes from Beginner to Advanced (Council of Europe A1 to C1) - No entry requirements

Typical timetable

Morning classes take place from 9.00 to 12.00. Afternoon classes from 13.00-15.00. Some activities take place in the late afternoon/early evening. Please see an example of an individual student's personal timetable below.

The English Language Centre organises educational visits to help you develop your English and your knowledge of UK life. These visits take place during class time. The International Office organises social trips in Durham and to other places of interest in the UK. These activities take place in the evenings and at weekends. These are priced between £10 - £20 depending on the activity and happen approximately once per month.



Age

Students must be over 16 years old to join our full-time courses. You will study alongside both adults and other young people in your general English classes, but under-18s will also attend special workshops designed to be of interest to you as a younger person (for example to help you stay safe and to prepare for your next stage in life). The parents of under 18s will also receive a copy of the termly reports and will be invited in to College to meet their child's tutor if they are in the UK. If you are under 18 you will need your parent/guardian to sign a consent form for you to enrol onto the programme. This will include information on supervision outside of class times and journeys to and from College.

Class sizes

Scheduled language classes contain no more than 18 students. In addition you will have the opportunity to meet other students and native English speakers in larger group activities.

Exam preparation classes

We also offer IELTS preparation and Cambridge Main Suite preparation classes which are full cost and a fee for these apply for all students. IELTS can be taken at nearby centres in Newcastle or Sunderland, and the cost is around £180. New College Durham is an exam centre for Cambridge Main Suite exams, so internal candidates can sit the exams on site. These exams cost in the region of £86.

Accommodation Options

Homestay Accommodation

Immerse yourself in the English language and experience the culture of Durham first-hand by choosing a homestay. We provide homestay accommodation, predominantly for international students who are under 18 years old. Our homestay are carefully checked to ensure they will provide you with a welcoming, comfortable and safe environment. Please note that the homestay accommodation is usually a bus journey away from college. No more than four students will be accommodated in any one homestay.

Families live within a one hour commute of New College Durham. Location is chosen based on travel time and not mileage from the College.

Private Halls of Residence (Students 18+)

There are several private halls of residence in Durham City that provide a range of accommodation options such as modern en-suite cluster bedrooms in a shared apartment or a private studio flat. They also have other facilities such as a common social space, games room and sometimes even a gym. Prices start from around £140.00 per week inclusive of bills.

Rented Accommodation (Students 18+)

The majority of rented accommodation in Durham is provided by private landlords or landlord consortiums. You can rent a bedroom in a shared house from around £90.00 per week. Some landlords include certain bills in their rent e.g. water rates, gas, electricity and Wifi. All landlords in the private rented sector in Durham will charge a refundable deposit (this is normally equivalent to one month rent).

Transport

There are two bus companies that operate around the North-East. Arriva tickets start from £5.50 daily or £22 weekly for students. Go North East bus tickets start from £4.50 daily or £17 weekly for students. (With valid student ID – this can be ordered via the college's student union office.)
